The NSF CCLI program supports efforts to create new learning materials and teaching strategies; develop faculty expertise; implement educational innovations; assess learning and evaluate innovations; and conduct research on science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) teaching and learning. Twelve CCLI awards have been received by SJSU faculty since 2000. This workshop will focus on guidelines, budget forms and frequently asked questions about the program. *Note: upcoming CCLI deadlines are expected as follows: Type I projects – 3rd week May 2010; Type II and III projects – January 2011.*

The Research Foundation's post-award services are designed to help you to focus on your project, rather than on its administration; however there are policies and procedures all account holders should be aware of. This workshop will help account managers of both research and self-support programs become familiar with SJSU post-award procedures - from how to get reimbursed to how to hire new employees and assign them to payroll. Meet the key post-award staff members who can assist you with managing the expenditure of your awarded funds.

The NIH AREA grant program supports small research projects in the biomedical and behavioral sciences. AREA grants are intended to create research opportunities for scientists and institutions that have not been major recipients of NIH research grant funds. This is an excellent opportunity for SJSU faculty to obtain NIH funding. Fifteen SJSU faculty members have received AREA awards since 1987. This workshop will review the program guidelines and submittal process, and guide faculty in writing a successful proposal. Proposal deadlines are [June 25](#) and [October 25](#) (non-AIDS-related); [May 1](#) and [September 1](#) (AIDS-related).

From locating funding sources to submitting a grant proposal, sponsored programs activity is increasingly occurring through electronic means. We will also cover the SJSU Research Foundation Funding Alerts system and the University Experts Database. This workshop will also provide an overview of how to submit proposals using web-based sponsor systems such as Grants.gov.
