Lionel Cheruzel and Lili Luo Honored at First Annual Celebration of Sponsored Research

he first annual SJSU Celebration of Sponsored Research took place in the Barrett Ballroom on October 18. The event honored all faculty who have applied for or have been awarded a sponsored research grant during the past fiscal year.

Exhibits at the event highlighted five of the Univer-

sity's prominent research projects, ranging from planet discovery to cybersecurity to film production.

The Early Career Investigator Awards (ECIA) were also presented at the event. The first went to Professor of Chemistry Lionel Cheruzel (College of Science), who has been tremendously productive in his field of

bioinorganic chemistry. He leads an active research group comprised of eight undergraduates and one graduate student focused on Cytochrome P450 and the synthetic potential for biotechnological applications.

Also receiving the 2012 award was Dr. Lili Luo, who has been an active researcher in the areas of reference services, online learning, and research methods education. Dr. Luo's scholarly activities include a partnership with the SJSU School of Social Work, where she is conducting joint research to explore how librarians and social workers can collaboratively improve access to information on local

social services resources. She has also published eight journal articles since joining the faculty, and in 2010 received the Outstanding Teacher's Award from the School of Library and Information Science.

The ECIA award recognizes SJSU tenure-track faculty who excel in research, scholarship and creative activity, and who have secured funds for research early in their careers. Both Dr. Cheruzel

and Dr. Luo have achieved exceptional levels of success in all of these areas.

Allocations to **Campus Top** \$1.8 Million

Research Foundation
Facility & Administrative (F&A) allocations to academic units for FY2011-12 provided \$1,862,061 in additional research funding to colleges, departments, and faculty project directors engaged in research.

F&A funds support the business infrastructure necessary to conduct externally sponsored programs, such as sponsored projects administration, Human Resources, finance, legal, audit and other general services. Within academic units, allocated F&A funds are used to pay for faculty release time, travel and student stipends in order to further research.

Services for Employees

VSP partners with Costco

The Research Foundation's vision benefit through VSP, Inc. has partnered with Costco. New for 2013: Aetna Dental

In its continuing commitment to enhancing employee benefits while also

reducing costs, the Research Foundation Human Resources department is pleased to announce a partnership with a new provider of dental benefits, Aetna.

Aetna Dental replaces The Guardian as the provider of dental benefits to Research Foundation employees, effective January 1, 2013.

The new Aetna dental plan increases the annual maximum benefit to each employee and dependent by \$250 per year. Also enhanced is Aetna's coverage for Out-of-Network dental care, which will also increase by \$250 per year.

Aetna's extensive network will support our employees across our many locations. More information will be posted on the Research Foundation web site no later than December 21, 2012, so stay tuned!

Save more for retirement!

For year 2013, the IRS has increased the 403(b) retirement plan elective deferral limit to \$17,500 per year. Employees may defer up to \$729.16 per semi-monthly pay period (\$17,500 divided by 24 pay periods) for retirement, if they choose to do so.

"Catch Up" contributions for employees age 50 and over remain at \$5,500 per year (in addition to the previously mentioned \$17,500).

Elective deferrals not only maximize your retirement savings, they may also reduce your income taxes.
